Did you lose Medicaid?

Stay connected to health care

You might have lost your Medicaid if:

YOU DID NOT TURN IN YOUR MEDICAID RENEWAL PAPERWORK:

- Login to your PEAK account and review the To-Do List. Click "Complete now" under the card titled "Late renewal". Or call your county and ask for help submitting a late renewal.
- You can also submit your paper renewal packet to your local county office.

• IMPORTANT TIP!

- If you need coverage for health expenses during this time, be sure to answer question #6 on the paper renewal packet or request additional health coverage after submitting your renewal on PEAK.
- You have to do this within 90 days of your renewal date. If it's passed the 90 days, you will need to submit a new application through PEAK or the paper application.

THE COUNTY OR STATE MADE A MISTAKE:

- If you turned in your renewal paperwork, but your denial said: "Did not submit verifications," there might be a mistake.
- This is not your fault, but you need to take action.
 Call or go to the County Department of Human Services.

YOU AREN'T ELIGIBLE ANYMORE:

• If you are no longer eligible for Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid program) or Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+), you still have health coverage options.

Other affordable health insurance options:

- Marketplace Insurance: Apply for insurance on Connect for Health Colorado, the state's insurance marketplace: www.connectforhealthco.com
 - Note: You have until July 31, 2024, to apply for a marketplace plan.
- **Employer Insurance**: Check with your employer to learn more about the insurance that they offer.

Other affordable care options:

- Hospital Discounted Care: Colorado law requires hospitals to give discounts to patients who qualify.
- GoodRx: GoodRx coupons offer discounts on many prescription drugs.
- Community Health Centers (CHCs): CHCs offer sliding-fee-scale payments, so your bill is based on your income. CHCs also have staff who can help you understand and enroll in health insurance. CHC map: cchn.org/map
